Warnings

This application must be completed to enable processer approval of hunters of wild mammals for animal consumption. The primary processor must retain a copy of this application for a period of at least 4 years in case of regulatory audit.

Information sought on this application is required to administer the Animal Products Act 1999. It is an offence under this Act to falsify or alter any statement with the intent to deceive and for the purpose of obtaining material benefit or avoiding material detriment. This Act provides penalties for offences involving deception of a fine of up to \$500,000 for companies, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding 5 years and a fine of up to \$100,000 for individuals.

Privacy Statement

1. The Applicant

Information sought on this application is required to administer the Animal Products Act 1999. The Privacy Act 1993 provides rights of access to, and correction of, personal information held in a readily retrievable form. The information is held by the primary processor for a minimum of 4 years.

Notes:

All details of the applicant must be provided. The hunters' approval is for 2 years from the date of approval. Unless renewed prior, the supplier's name will be removed from the list after 2 years.

2. The Primary Processor

It is the primary processor's responsibility to assess the competency of the applicant.

It is the primary processor's responsibility to re-approve suppliers every 2 years and maintain a current list of approved suppliers.

The applicant must be positively identified by sighting reference identification such as the applicant's drivers licence and gun licence.

This form must be retained by the primary processor for at least 4 years.
